

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BUCKET CHALLENGE







15 MINUTES



GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

A challenge to test your throwing and aiming skills.

You'll need three containers of different sizes. We suggest a large laundry basket, a washing up bowl and then a dessert bowl.

Create a throwing line. Place the laundry basket a metre from that line, the washing up bowl a metre behind that and the dessert bowl another metre behind that.

Bundle your pairs of socks so that they create 5 'balls' you can throw. From the throwing line try to throw the sock balls into the containers. The closest one is worth 2 points, the middle one is worth 4 and the furthest away one is worth 6 points. What can you score after 5 throws? Keep playing the game and see what the highest score is you can get in 5 throws.

Ask a grown-up to take a video of your best attempt and share it with your BB group or post on social media using **#BBatHOME**.

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EASTER GARDEN







READY TO GO

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Using items found in the garden, create an Easter garden to retell the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Fill a tray/plate with layer of soil. On one side on the tray/plate make a small mound with soil. Tie two twigs together to create a cross and stick this into the mound. This represents Jesus' crucifixion.

On the other side place a small flower pot or yoghurt pot to create the tomb. Infront of the tomb place a large stone. This represents the stone that sealed Jesus' body in the tomb and was found rolled away on Easter Sunday.

Create a small winding path from the tomb to the edge of the tray and then decorate the rest of the tray with leaves, grass and flowers such as daisies to help make it look colourful.

Ask a grown-up to take a photo of your Easter Garden and share it with your BB group or post on social media using **#BBatHOME**.

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MINI EGG COOKIES









PREPARATION NEEDED

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Bake some tasty Easter themed mini egg cookies to share with the family.

- In a bowl beat together the butter, sugar and vanilla. Do this until the mixture is pale and fluffy. Add the egg and beat again.
- 2) Tip in the flour and bicarb and mix together. Finally add in the chocolate chips and half of your mini eggs. Crush these up first into small chunks.
- Scoop small ball sized mounds of cookie dough onto a lined baking tray, leaving plenty of space between each cookie. You may need to use multiple cooking trays or cook them in batches. Push the remaining mini eggs on top of the cookie dough.
- 4) Bake for 15-18 minutes at 190c / 170c Fan / Gas 5. Cookies should be golden around the edges and pale & soft in the middle. Leave to cool before placing on a wire rack to cool.

- 175g Butter
- 200g Brown Sugar ½ tsp Bicarbonate
 - r of Soda

250g Plain Flour

- 100g Caster Sugar of Soc
- 1 tbsp Vanilla Extract 1 Large Egg
- stract50g Chocolate Chips100g Mini Eggs

Please supervise and assist this activity particularly when using the oven. An adult should initiate any contact with the BB group and/or share on social media.



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Take some time to remember the meaning behind Easter, using a packet of M&Ms.

Easter is a special time for Christians. It's the period where we think about Jesus dying on the cross and his resurrection a few days later. This represents Jesus dying on the cross for our sins and the promise of eternal life.

Use the M&M Easter poem (found at the bottom of this pack) to remind yourself of the important meaning behind Easter. You'll need a packet of M&M sweets to help read the poem.

After reading the poem, take some time to reflect on the Easter story. Watch **'The Story of Easter (Jesus' Sacrifice)' by Saddleback Kids** on YouTube

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PREPARATION NEEDED

SETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Help spread some love this Easter, by leaving an Easter Egg on a neighbour's doorstep as a random act of kindness.

A grown-up will need to purchase a small Easter egg from a shop. It doesn't have to be a large expensive egg, a £1 egg would be perfect.

Create a card or note to go with the egg. Think about a positive message, picture or even a joke you might want to share with your neighbour that will make them smile. You could mention that you are part of the Boys' Brigade and completing a #BBatHOME activity.

Ask a grown-up to leave the Easter egg and card/note on a neighbour's doorstep. Remember to abide by social distancing rules and good hygiene practises at all times.

Ask a grown-up to take a photo of the Easter egg on your neighbour's doorstep and share it with your BB group or post on social media using **#BBatHOME**.

SETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

We are currently living through a piece of history - something that will be talked about for years to come. Create a time capsule to capture this history for you and your family to open in the future.

A Letter to Yourself: Write a letter to your future self. Write down what it's like to be in lockdown, how life has changed, what you are doing with your time and what #BBatHOME activities you have done. Alternatively record a video and put it onto a memory stick.

A Family Photo: Take a family photo to print off and place in your time capsule. This will help you to remember what you all looked like and your ages during this time.

Newspaper: Look through a newspaper or online news and cut out news stories that help to remind you about what is happening.

Once complete, place it all into a box (an old lunch box would be ideal), seal it with tape and then place it somewhere safe to open in 5 or 10 years time.
