TREASURE HUNT



GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Head outdoors on a treasure hunt, helping to explore your local area.

Treasure hunts help children to take a closer look at the world around them. Hunting for clues encourages children to follow instructions and build observation skills. Create a treasure hunt for your group using one of the following methods:

Hunt for Clues: Set up a traditional treasure hunt with clues to find along the way. This might be based around signs in shop windows, house names, notices on bus stops and so on. Give each group a question paper and see who can get the most questions correct.

A-Z Treasure Hunt: Give each group a piece of paper with the letters A-Z on the side. Challenge the groups to find objects on a walk, one beginning with each letter - it's harder than it sounds! Give a bonus point if they find something that the other groups don't.

Photo Hunt: Set the groups some photo challenges to complete whilst out on a walk. These might be photos of local shops, landmarks, places etc or you might set challenges to find photos of wildlife, vehicles, flowers and so on.
