▶▶ GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Does God really care about 'average' people and if so, why? This directly links to the 'Distinctly Average' challenge in the House of Games theme and should be used as part of that activity.

Comparing ourselves to others is natural, particularly in a social media world full of filters and fake posts. This can lead us to feeling inadequate, incapable and not very special.

By constantly comparing yourself to others, you might start to feel a bit 'average'. For example, you might be able to play football, but aren't a star player. OK at school but not top of the class. Alright at FIFA but some of your friends are better. If God apparently gave us all talents to make us special, then what are mine?

God doesn't care if we are the best at something or 'just' average. God could have made us better at the things we feel average at, but he didn't. He purposefully chose to make us exactly how we are, because he has a plan for you and loves you. God doesn't care if you can give him an Olympic Gold medal or 3rd place in an egg and spoon race - all God cares about is that you give him your all and commit yourself 100% to him. Stop comparing yourself to others and start looking to God instead.
