AIM

Reckon you can name the top ten selling crisps in the UK, the top ten scorers in the Premier League or the top ten movies of the 2010s? Put your knowledge to the test in this Top Ten challenge activity.

WHAT YOU'LL NEED

- Top Ten PowerPoint
- Projector / Large TV
- Computer
- Pens / Paper (Optional)
- Top Ten Answers Sheet

GET LEARNING: TOP TEN

THEME: PROBLEM SOLVING



LEADER PREPARATION

A leader will need to download the 'Top Ten' PowerPoint and have a means of showing this to the group for the activity (i.e. Projector / Large TV). A leader will also need a copy of the answers sheet.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

This activity challenges young people to try and think of the top ten things in a certain category. Complete the activity in one of the below ways or adapt the game to suit your group.

Head-to-Head: Split into two teams. For each round ask the question. The team that buzzes in first (makes a noise) can give the first answer. If it is the top answer, they can play the round. If it's not the top answer, then the other team can give an answer. If their answer is higher, they steal the round and play on. The team playing should then try to provide the other answers in the top ten. Get all 10 answers to win the round. Each wrong answer loses a life. If three lives are lost in a round, play turns over to the other team. They then have one attempt to provide one other correct answer. If they do this, they win the round. If they fail, then the round is given to the original team. The team who has won the most rounds at the end of the game wins.

Shout it Out! Split into two or more teams and sit them in separate parts of the meeting space with a leader each. Read out the question. Teams can then immediately start shouting out answers to their leader. Incorrect answers are just ignored (i.e. no consequence). The first team to tick off all 10 answers from the top ten can shout out 'done' and end the round for everyone. The team with the most rounds at the end of the game wins.

Against the Clock: The same as 'Shout it Out!' however the group is only given 60 seconds to shout out their answers to their leader. A point is given for each correct answer. After each round, see how many correct answers each team got. The team with the most points at the end of the game wins.

Quiz Style: Split into teams. Read out the question and then give teams a few minutes to discuss their answers as a group and agree on their top ten. Afterwards, go through the answers, awarding a point for every correct answer they found and two points for every answer in the correct ranking position. The team with the most points at the end of the game wins.



IDEAS TO TAKE THIS FURTHER...

Afterwards, challenge the group to come up with their own 'Top Ten' style questions. Once the questions have been prepared, let the young people try out their top ten questions on the rest of the group.
