SORT THE YEAR







PREPARATION NEEDED

AIM

A new year brings with it a new calendar full of important dates and celebrations. Help sort out the year and learn about some of these celebrations, from Pancake Day to Christmas, Bonfire Night to April Fool's Day. Can you get them all in the right order?

GET LEARNING: SORT THE YEAR

THEME: ME AND MY WORLD



LEADER PREPARATION



A leader will need to print out a copy of the 'Sort the Year' activity sheet and cut up the cards. This activity works best in small teams, so ensure you have a copy for each team.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

- Split into small teams (roughly 5-6 per team). Give each team a copy of the 'Sort the Year' activity cards. These cards should be cut up beforehand. Some of the cards have important days of the year (Remembrance Day, Christmas Day, April Fools Day etc) and others have dates on (11th November, 25th December, 1st April etc).
- Children are tasked with trying to match the important days with the dates.
- Give the teams a few minutes to try and match as many as they can. For those they aren't sure of, encourage the children to guess. Teams can also try to line up the pairs in order of when they happen throughout the year (i.e. Creating a line with New Year's Day at one end and Boxing Day at the other end).
- After a short while, see how many days and dates the teams have got correct. Which team achieved the most correct matches?
- 5 Go through all the answers, so children can learn the correct dates for any they may have got wrong. As you go through the answers, spend a moment on each important day and have a little chat about what we celebrate / mark on that day and why. Try to let the children lead this discussion, based on their knowledge of each celebration.

Do the group have a favourite day of the year they look forward to? Are there any other celebrations not mentioned that also happen throughout the year?



Take part in a 'Get Creative' activity with children making / decorating a calendar that they can take home and hang up, helping them to remember all the important dates throughout the year.
