GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

The Queen has a strong Christian faith, just like millions of other Christians around the world. Spend some time looking at quotes made by famous Christians and the meaning behind their words.

- Split into small groups. Each group will need a copy of the eight quotes and the eight famous Christians. These should be cut up into their individual quotes / faces.
- 2 Can you match the quote to the famous Christian who said it? This activity is quite challenging, so don't worry if you aren't too sure, just have a quick guess based on who you think would say each quote. Allow a few minutes for each group to move the quotes and faces around until they are happy with their guesses. Compare the answers from the different groups.
- Reveal the answers. The answer being that this is actually a bit of a trick challenge, as all the quotes are made by just one person – The Queen. All the other famous Christians were just red-herrings in this activity.
- The Queen hasn't led a quiet Christian life, keeping her faith to herself, but has used opportunities in speeches, broadcasts and messages to share what her faith means to her and how it motivates her in her life. Her faith is at the centre of everything she has done over the last 70 years as Queen.
- As a group take a closer look at one or two of the quotes.
 - · What do you think The Queen is trying to say?
 - Why do you think The Queen thinks it important for her to talk about her faith publicly?
 - Can you find Bible verses to compliment her quotes?

IDEAS TO TAKE THIS FURTHER...

The Queen used her first Christmas broadcast to ask the nation to pray for her as she started in her role as Queen. As a group, create a prayer for The Queen that gives thanks to God for her service and continues to ask God to love and support her.
