ONE BIG MESSAGE OF HOPE Annual Report 21/22





There are moments when time stands still. People recall exactly where they were and what they were doing when historic events happened. I'll never forget being in Newport, preparing to chair a District Executive meeting last September, when my mobile rang. My sister Ruth, aged 55, had taken ill. Before I reached home, she had gone to be with Jesus. We grieved but not as those who are without hope.

Ruth was deaf but heard things others can't hear – the longing of every heart to feel your life matters. She never forgot a birthday. Ruth was blind but saw things others can't see – the potential that exists in every situation. She conquered every challenge in school, in work and in social situations. Ruth was without speech (she communicated using sign language) but her life spoke loudly and clearly about the hope she had in Jesus.

Throughout this 21/22 session, when we have been considering our future direction, Ruth's legacy has motivated me to genuinely listen to every opinion, to see the potential that exists in The Boys' Brigade in Northern Ireland and to put Jesus first. Our 'One Big Message of Hope' mission was the highlight by far and it is my hope that we will allow God to guide every step that lies ahead.

Over 7,500 children and young people heard One Big Message of Hope!

Having been postponed twice due to Covid, plans were made for Mission 22 - eight live events in various locations in NI on four consecutive Saturdays in February 2022. Due to a rise in Covid cases in early Jan 22 plans were changed and Mission 22 became a 'Big Night In' that companies ran in their own hall.

Partnering with Crown Jesus Ministries, we produced two lively interactive videos; one for under 11s called Klass Kids and one for over 11s called One Way Youth. Each video came with guidance and suggestions to help BB leaders provide an engaging and fun experience for children and young people in BB in their own venue. With God's help, Mission 22 reached more children and young people than we had first imagined.

Education Authority

FUNDING NEWS



THE NATIONAL LOTTERY

Dormant Accounts Fund NI supports the voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) sector in Northern Ireland to be more resilient and prepared for the future by funding activity that increases capacity and sustainability. The programme supports organisations to adapt to future challenges and be more financially resilient.

The funding distributed through Dormant Accounts Fund NI is not generated through National Lottery activity. Dormant accounts are UK bank and building society accounts that have been untouched for 15 or more years, and where banks and building societies are unable to trace the customer who owns the account.

Dormant Accounts Fund

A successful funding award from the Dormant Accounts Fund allows us to increase our digital capabilities in this coming year.

We're investing in IT to equip Newport for live streaming and podcasting, in addition to the employment of a part-time multi-media assistant.

The funding enables us to build on our very successful 'Open to More' YLT for young leaders in 2021 and a similar training weekend, 'Step Up', took place recently. We've established a new young leaders forum to build community and encouragement among our younger leaders.

The final part of the funding will provide training and development for our new trustee body and our staff team.




What I like about BB...




What I like about BB...


What I like about BB...
