LEADER PREPARATION

A leader will need to print out the 10 'You've Found a Bear' images and place these in locations around your local area. Copies of the 'We're Going On a Bear Hunt' activity sheet will also need to be printed.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

- A leader should select an appropriate location for the bear hunt. This could be at your local park or the streets near your meeting location. If you aren't able to get outside, then this activity could also be set up inside your meeting space.
- Once a location/route have been chosen, a leader should place the 10 'You've Found a Bear' images along the route. This might be by attaching them to trees, fence posts, inside shop windows (with permission), on lampposts etc.
- Children should be given copies of the 'We're Going On a Bear Hunt' activity sheet.
- Before starting the activity, ask the children how many different types of bears they can name. Which bears do they think they will find on their bear hunt?
- Leaders should walk the children along the route, instructing children to keep an eye out for bears along the way. Their job is to try and find all 10 bears and tick them off on their sheet. Who will be the first to spot the bear each time?
- Each time a bear has been found, encourage the group to take a look at what type of bear it is and the 'Did You Know?' facts too. Ask one child to read out the facts to the rest of the group. What can you learn along the way?
- Complete the challenge, trying to find all 10 bears before making it back home.

IDEAS TO TAKE THIS FURTHER...

Before or after the activity read the well-known children's story 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen. The group could complete the actions that go with the story too.


DID YOU KNOW?

- · Brown, Black and Polar bears all hibernate for the winter, sleeping for around 100 days.


KEEPING VERYONE SAFE

DID YOU KNOW?

- Polar bears have black skin.
- Male polar bears can grow to 3 metres long and weigh as much as 10 men (800kg+).



GIANT PANDA

BROWN BEAR

DID YOU KNOW?

- Brown bears have an incredible sense of smell, often smelling prey from 20 miles away.
- Brown bears can run at speeds of up to 35mph. That's much quicker than we can run!

- Winnie got his name from a black bear that was living in London Zoo.

DID YOU KNOW?
