GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

What is the Challenge? The Monopoly Challenge tasks groups with attempting to visit as many locations on a Monopoly board as possible within a time limit (i.e. 5 hours). Groups must take a photo at each location before then racing to the next one. Locations can be visited in any order.

How to Complete the Challenge?

- **Nominate the location:** Many towns and cities have their own Monopoly boards. Find one suitable for you. This could be your own area, or a nearby town or city.
- **Research the location:** Take a look at the different locations on the board. Do all of the places still exist? Are they all easy to navigate to or are some a lot further away than the rest? You may need to adjust a few of the locations on your list to help make sure the challenge is achievable.
- **Transport:** How will groups transport themselves between the different locations? Ideally this should be done via public transport (i.e. busses). However, in some towns/cities it may be possible to walk to all locations or alternatively use transport such as bikes.
- Photo challenges: At each location the group will need to take a photo to prove they have visited it. You could set a specific photo challenge at each location (i.e. underneath a sign, next to a particular shop in that street, beside a landmark etc). To help add to the challenge, you could make some clues cryptic (i.e. outside the place where 'every little helps' = Tesco).
- Competition: Could you make the challenge into a competition? To do this you'll need to have two or more groups competing. This could be made up just from young people in your own Company or you could invite neighbouring Companies to join you. A point can be awarded for each location a group makes it to. An additional 5 points can be given to the group that makes it to each location first. The team with the most points at the end of the day wins.
