



A beginner's guide to: X

What is X?

Formerly known as Twitter, X is a social media platform which is free to use on computers, and free to download on smartphones. All you need to be able to use X is an account which can be made online by completing a simple registration form.

To create an account, you must be aged 13+ and have an email address of phone number.


On X, people can share posts which contain up to 280 characters (numbers, letters, emojis and/or symbols), as well as photographs and videos with their followers. Similar to most other social media platforms, followers are other accounts which can interact with your account – usually these are friends, family, colleagues, etc. However, when you have created your account, you have the option to have a private or public account. If you choose a private account only your followers can see your content and you must approve new followers, but if you choose public, anyone can look at your content. You can choose this within your profile settings.

To create an account on X, simply click the 'create account' button on the home page. Once you've clicked this, there are five steps to complete.

- The first asks for your name, phone number (or you can use your email address) and date of birth don't worry, this won't be shown on your profile, it's just to make sure you are 13+!
- You'll then be asked if you're happy for X to suggest people to follow based on your personal details (phone number/email address), you don't have to tick these boxes, so you can leave them blank!
- The third step asks you to verify your phone number or email address. X will send you a code which needs to be put in the verification box which pops up.
- To keep your account secure, you'll now be asked to create a password which is 8 or more characters – make sure it's memorable as you'll need this to log in!
- To make your profile more personalised, it's time to upload a profile photograph. We
 would like you to use the BB logo, which can be downloaded from the brand
 guidelines here.
- Once you've uploaded your profile photograph, it's time to create a bio. This is a short paragraph about what people who visit your X profile can expect to see you





only get 160 characters so use them wisely. Here is an example bio which can be used as a template – just fill in the gaps!

- The final step in setting up your account is choosing a username. Your username will need to be unique and is what people will use to find your account. No two accounts can have the same username. Please focus your username on your BB group's name using either of the following formats:
 - Boys' Brigade, Company number and location e.g., BB1stHowden / BB11thNorthants
 - Company number, location, BB e.g., 1stHowdenBB / 11thNorthantsBB

When you're setting up the X account, there will be a few final set-up steps, including turning on notifications, choosing up to three interests to help X show you relevant content – remember, you're setting this up on behalf of BB so we would suggest you choose outdoors, family & relationships and sports. You'll also be asked to start following at least one account from a list which X puts forwards – we would suggest following a news outlet relevant to your area.

That's your account all set up - your BB group is now on X!

The last thing to do before starting to follow other accounts is to pick a header for your profile! A header picture is shown at the top of your profile, it's a little bit like a secondary profile photograph. As such, this photograph should highlight what the BB does so we have created a handy header which can be downloaded here.

To do upload a header, click on the 'profile' button and then when you're on your profile click on 'set up'.

Finding people to follow and growing your following

You can find other BB groups by firstly following the national BB X page - @theboysbrigade – and then looking through the people who follow the account/who the national account follows. To start following someone new, simply click 'follow'.



Once you have started following other accounts, their posts will start showing up on your homepage. By following other groups, it'll give you ideas for content you could post on your own BB profile. The more you follow, the more ideas you'll get that you can use yourself!
