## Reflections on the last year...

This vear we have seen our first young people being awarded their King's Badge in over 70 years. I'd like to congratulate them and all of our children and young people for what they have achieved over the last 12 months through being part of The Boys' Brigade.

Recognising and celebrating achievements - whether large or small may sound simple, but in a world where so many negative influences are close at hand I do think that more than ever that it's important for children and young people to feel supported, encouraged and valued.

I was recently able to join with young people taking part in our KGVI Youth Leader Training courses at Carronvale House and Broomley Grange. These opportunities to support young people into leadership pathways are crucial to both our present and future.

Whether it's KGVI, our Young Leaders Weekend or our new course 'Elevate' - bringing young leaders together to have space to develop their skills, learn from each other and broaden their understanding of how BB works beyond their own Company is invaluable.

The work of the Ministry Team in raising our profile with Churches and developing strategic partnership has continued. We recently joined with Youthscape to

play a leading role at the Christian youth festival, Satellites. Our presence shows our commitment to shaping confident, Christcentred young leaders for today's world. and we are looking at other opportunities to do this over the next year.

I am delighted by the continued investment from both the UK Government through the Department for Media, Culture and Sport's 'Uniformed Youth Fund' and the Scottish Government's 'Children, Young People and Families Early Intervention Fund'. The funding we receive I believe is recognition of the value and impact of our work today.

As part of our current strategy to improve the quality and consistency of experience for children and young people we have commissioned independently led consultations with members around the volunteer led support layer of the organisation and also about inclusion. The learnings and next steps on both of these areas we have reviewed will be integral to our next five-year strategy to be launched next year.

Finally, may I thank all our dedicated volunteer leaders in communities across the UK and Rol for everything they do, as well as to all our supporters, partner organisations and funders.
